

A new tree was planted by the Archdeacon of Rochdale, Venn Cherry Vann (with a little help) in the grounds of St Lawrence Church Denton on Sunday 29<sup>th</sup> July.

This replaced a very large tree removed last year because it was affecting the structure of the church building.

This new tree is a sign of new life for a church building about to undergo a major reordering project, enabling the whole community to use this amazing historic building, as well as it continuing as a place of Anglican worship.

The reordering project will

- level the very uneven floor
- install a new heating system
- create a community room with fully accessible toilet and drinks facilities
